Being only an hour from Toowoomba and two hours from Brisbane, and with lots of investment in the local economy, both schools' staff believe they have the best of everything living in Warwick.

"Having come to Warwick from Brisbane, my career options have expanded and my after work and weekend time is filled with local music, social events, motor sports at Morgan Park, walks in the nearby National parks and visiting the many new eateries that are popping up all the time," said Chris Cook, teacher at Assumption College.
