ORGANISATIONAL OVERVIEW

Founded by St Ignatius Loyola more than 450 years ago, the Society of Jesus (also known as the Jesuits) is an international religious order of priests and brothers within the Catholic Church committed to service in the world in a variety of ways.

The Jesuit presence in Australia began in 1848 and the Australian Province of the Society of Jesus now comprises more than 100 Jesuits. They work in over 30 ministries in companionship with some 1800 women and men who share the Ignatian vision of the service of faith and the promotion of justice.

Begun in 2010, The Cardoner Project now known as The Cardoner Network was a response to the desire of young adults for Catholic faith Formation in the Ignatian tradition. It is a young adult ministry of the Australian Jesuits, a Catholic Religious Order. Its current centre in Chippendale, in the middle of the University precinct, was purchased in April 2013 and now houses a variety of interconnected programmes.

Position Objective

The primary responsibilities of the role are:

- To help build a community of young adults and implement Formation events and programmes, including retreats, to help young adults to develop faith and leadership commitments to be witnesses in service to those in need
- To build and maintain relationships with relevant decision makers in schools, in order to "sell in" programmes and workshops to be delivered by young adult members of The Cardoner Network
- To assist with the content creation and delivery of programmes and workshops for the post-school young adult and senior high school students
- To assist with the recruiting and training of programme presenters
- To be a collaborative team member, willing to assist other members of the Network as required.

Position Specific Responsibilities

- Build relationships with young adults and facilitate opportunities for them to come together, especially by utilizing space at 202 Broadway, Chippendale
- Build and maintain relationships with schools; including Jesuit, Jesuit companion, Catholic Independent and Catholic Systemic Schools.
- Develop an understanding of the type of Formation offerings the schools would want, and seek to ensure that our programmes/workshops cater to these needs where appropriate
- Organize regular Formation events at 202 Broadway, possibly including lunches, dinners and other gatherings
- Assist in planning and delivering off-site overnight retreats for young adults
- Support the Formation programme of the In-Community and With-Community offerings
- Work with the Rector to recruit and select a pool of presenters to help animate the young adult community and deliver the programme schedule throughout the school year
- Train and rehearse presenters
- Maintain a diary of event bookings and manage the logistics and preparation timelines required, including securing the required presenters, content review, travel and any accommodation logistics and securing of future bookings.
- Support the refresh/build/extension of the programmes offered
- Ensure invoicing is completed on time and in full (OTIF); in conjunction with the Finance Manager
- Review the pricing structures and presenter compensation
- Work with/brief the marketing team to deliver supporting materials both digital and hard copy

- Ensure the presenters help advertise the opportunity to join/support the Cardoner works and experiences
- Any other tasks as directed by the Rector
