As a senior system leader, the Deputy Diocesan Director Catholic Education Port Pirie will represent, support, report to and assist the Diocesan Director, and act with delegated authority on behalf of the Diocesan Director as appropriate.

The Deputy Diocesan Director, Catholic Education Diocese of Port Pirie will join the Catholic Education Office (CEO) team based in Port Pirie, and collaborate as part of a broader Catholic Education South Australia team, to ultimately serve leaders, staff, students and families across the vast landscape, communities and contexts that comprise our Diocese.

The Deputy Diocesan Director Catholic Education Diocese of Port Pirie will be a dynamic leader of mission, with a commitment to further strengthening outcomes and opportunities for children and young people in regional and remote Catholic school contexts. This role will suit a leader with vision and a deep commitment to enabling hope-filled futures for all who encounter the richness of excellent Catholic education in our schools.

The Deputy Diocesan Director Catholic Education Diocese of Port Pirie will have proven experience, knowledge and demonstrated successful system leadership in Catholic education, and a core desire to lead and work to achieve excellence, through a strong vision for faith, education and equitable access for all students.

This position offers a unique opportunity to work collaboratively to envision and implement a range of key system initiatives within the context of CDPP schools, including but not limited to development and oversight of implementation of the following key priorities:

The Deputy Diocesan Director will work closely with the Diocesan Director and the Thebarton based Catholic Education office colleagues to bring the vision of Catholic Education SA to life:

In each learning area, across the whole life of the school, and in partnership with families, each of us discovers the love of God which is revealed in Christ, proclaimed by the Church and lived by all people of good will.

Through all facets of this senior executive leadership role, the Deputy Diocesan Director Catholic Education, Diocese of Port Pirie will operate with a high degree of autonomy to achieve the strategic objectives and implement the South Australian Commission for Catholic Schools' *Towards 2027: Expanding Horizons and Deepening Practices – Strategy for Catholic Education South Australia.*

Whilst this role requires leadership of all Strategy areas, the Deputy Diocesan Director Port Pirie will have a key role and responsibility for leading culture and change, in partnership with key stakeholders, in strategic areas with particular relevance and contextual application within Diocese of Port Pirie schools, relating, but not limited, to:

This role requires the Deputy Diocesan Director, Catholic Education Diocese of Port Pirie to be fully cognisant of all operational areas of the Port Pirie Catholic Education Office to be able to assume responsibility as Acting Diocesan Director and to represent the Diocesan Director when appropriate.



- Completed CESA Employment Declaration Form
