Woorabinda is an Aboriginal community located two hours inland from Rockhampton. The Woorabinda Ministry is a Catholic presence to the community and an agent of reconciliation and healing. At the centre of this organisation is Sr Cecilia Prestashewsky MFIC who lives in the community and delivers this ministry on her own, providing pastoral care and sacramental support to the people.

Proceeds will help Sr Cecilia buy Bird watching binoculars for the 8 Rangers at Woorabinda as they are hoping to teach them to ID birds & do a monthly bird count for Birdlife Australia.

The next Preloved book sale will be held Sunday 12 November at St Jospeh's Cathedral outdoor shelter from 10:30am - 1pm, all proceeds raised will be donated to Woorabinda.

The Catholic Diocese of Rockhampton has also set up a Containers for Change Account, member number C11132635. All money raised from contributions taken to Containers for Change depots (allocated to the Diocesan account) will be donated to the Woorabinda ministry.
