

CATHOLIC EDUCATION WA RECOGNISES 2023 HIGH ACHIEVERS

Seventy-six Year 12 graduates from Catholic schools across WA have been recognised as Catholic Education Western Australia Ltd's (CEWA) high achievers for 2023.

The graduates and their families were invited to the annual Academic Excellence Awards ceremony in Leederville to celebrate their achievements. The award recipients included those students who achieved an Australian Tertiary Admission Ranking (ATAR) of 99 and above, as well as those who received a Pinnacle Award from the School Curriculum and Standards Authority in ATAR and VET pathways.

One third of eligible Year 12 students in Catholic schools achieved an ATAR above 90, with 53 students obtaining an ATAR of 99+. Twelve students received Exhibitions; they were:

- Noah Smith from Sacred Heart College received a Subject Exhibition for Engineering Studies
- Willem Degli Esposti from Mazenod College received a Subject Exhibition for English
- Amanda Barilla from Newman College received a Subject Exhibition for Outdoor Education
- Nicholas Kelly from St Norbert College received a VET Exhibition for Construction Industries

Two students, Murali Nguyen and Matthew Vinci, received the maximum possible ATAR of 99.95.
