[Melbourne, 24/02/2025] As violence escalates, eastern DRC remains one of the deadliest conflicts since WWII, with six million lives lost since 1996. Mass graves expose ongoing atrocities as armed groups fight over mineral-rich land, displacing millions and subjecting civilians to massacres, kidnappings, and human rights abuses.

In a compelling new interview, Nicaise Mundurame CSsR, a Redemptorist Brother, journalist, and lawyer, shares his insights on the complex geopolitical forces shaping the DRC today. This conversation sheds light on the historical roots of the crisis, the involvement of foreign powers, and the devastating humanitarian toll that is often overlooked by international media. Despite the immense suffering, Brother Nicaise highlights the resilience of faith and the role of the Church in bringing hope to those caught in the crossfire.
